## **Course Aims and Learning Outcomes**

This course is designed to give you the opportunity to:

- provide a comprehensive overview of the field English Language Teaching;
- encourage you to engage critically with current thinking about English language teaching and learning and classroom practices in different contexts;
- provide you with the tools to plan and carry out a piece of advanced research in an educational setting, and
- develop your teaching skills further and allow you to obtain the Certificate for English Language Teaching to Adults (CELTA)\*.

This course is designed to:

- increase your knowledge and awareness of learning and teaching English in different contexts and settings;
- engage you critically with current trends and practices in English language teaching and learning;

• provide you with the tools to plan and carry out a piece of advanced research in an educational context.

What will you learn?

#### Knowledge

- Develop your understanding of relevant current issues in English language teaching in order to help you build a solid foundation for your professional practice;
- Provide you with the theoretical foundations for effective English language teaching practice.

## Thinking Skills

- Improve your critical thinking and analytical skills;
- Examine and challenge your pre-existing beliefs and knowledge about language learning and teaching.

## Subject-based Practical Skills

- Enable you to have a systematic and conceptual understanding of issues concerning teaching and learning English for all age ranges and for different purposes;
- Enable you to use research to inform your daily practice and decision-making as language educator.

#### Skills for life and work

- Enable you to analyse the social and cultural factors which influence English language teaching in specific contexts;
- Enable you to inquiry your professional practice by designing and undertaking a small-scale research study.

## Learning and Teaching

You will be expected to demonstrate enhanced specialist knowledge of the field, provide evidence of independent thinking, and reflect on your learning in each module. You will also be expected to read a wide range of set and recommended texts and to critically engage with these.

All lectures involve group discussion of input which relates to your own practice and professional experience. Group work and the sharing of experience are a fundamental part of the course.

You may also be required to carry out tasks in your own teaching context to support assignment work.

All participants will be required to undertake private study and to prepare an assignment/assignments for each module – all of which contribute towards the final assessment.

Knowledge is developed through:

- Guided reading;
- Knowledge-based activities with feedback;
- In class and online discussions

Thinking skills are developed through:

- Workshops
- Practical activities with feedback
- Reporting findings both written and orally

Subject-based practical skills are developed through:

- Small-scale research projects
- Review of bibliographical sources and current research
- Planning, teaching and assessing learning

Skills for life and work are developed through:

- In class and online discussions.
- Presentations

#### Assessment

Assessment will be formative and summative and will be based on the variety of assignment types submitted for each module as well as a dissertation consisting of a 14,000-word report. Each module has a written requirement of 5,000 words (which in some cases may take the form of two assignments each of 2,500 words or a portfolio), and the dissertation, which has a written requirement of 14,000 words.

Knowledge is assessed by:

- Coursework;
- Essays

Thinking skills are assessed by:

- · Coursework:
- · Project work.

Practical skills are assessed by:

- Practical reports;
- Portfolio completion.

Students with disabilities and/or particular learning needs should discuss assessments with the Course Leader to ensure they are able to fully engage with all assessment within the course.

## Work or Study Placements

The course includes a teaching placement (ED-XX Teaching and Learning ELT, Independent Negotiated Placement) requiring you to spend 15 hours observing and teaching lessons in an educational setting. You have to arrange this placement well in advance of the starting date of the module. For students who have some considerable classroom experience, Accreditation of Experiential Learning (AEL) may be requested. The AEL process includes the submission of a 3,000-word reflective report, relevant evidence and the payment of an administration fee. You are strongly advised to be in a teaching job during the course since the assessment is mostly based on your teaching practice.

If you opt for the Teaching Practicum module (leading to CELTA), you will be allocated a teaching setting for you to undertake both lesson observations and the teaching practice element of the module.

### Course Structure

All courses are credit-rated to help you to understand the amount and level of study that is

#### needed.

One credit is equal to 10 hours of directed study time (this includes everything you do e.g. lecture, seminar and private study).

Credits are assigned to one of 5 levels:

- 3 Equivalent in standard to GCE 'A' level and is intended to prepare students for year one of an undergraduate degree course.
- 4 Equivalent in standard to the first year of a full-time undergraduate degree course.
- 5 Equivalent in standard to the second year of a full-time undergraduate degree course.
- 6 Equivalent in standard to the third year of a full-time undergraduate degree course.
- 7 Equivalent in standard to a Master's degree.

Courses are made up of modules that are each credit weighted. The module structure of this course:

Please note: Optional modules might not run every year, the course team will decide on an annual basis which options will be running, based on student demand and academic factors, in order to create the best learning experience.

Additional detail about the course module structure:

The modules are taught in the following sequence:

- Semester A (September December): ED7605 and ED7606
- Semester B: (January March) ED7601 and ED7XXX
- Semester C: (April -June) ED7XXX, if you have passed all the previous modules. If this is not the case, you will complete the module the following semester. You are advised, however, to complete your applied research project at the first opportunity.

The overall credit-rating of this course is 180 credits. If for some reason you are unable to achieve this credit you may be entitled to an intermediate award, the level of the award will depend on the amount of credit you have accumulated. ## Course Specific Regulations

\*The successful completion of the Teaching Practicum module entitles students to the Certificate of English Language Teaching to Adults (CELTA). Students opting for the Teaching Practicum are exempted from ED7606 Approaches to Teaching and Learning in ELT. This option is only available to on-campus students.

## **Typical Duration**

It is possible to move from full-time to part-time study and vice-versa to accommodate any external factors such as financial constraints or domestic commitments. Many of our students make use of this flexibility and this may impact on the overall duration of their study period.

The duration of this course is one calendar year full-time if enrolment is in September, and two calendar years part-time.

The time limit for completion of a course is four years after first enrolment on the course.
